Staff Member Highlight of the Month

Each month we choose a standout individual to be our staff member of the month. This month, we chose and interviewed our school's before and aftercare staff member, Martin Davy, and we got a bunch of cool info about him!

Martin Davy was born in London, England, to parents from Panama and Jamaica, but was raised in New York because he immigrated with his family at age seven. He has one brother now in Washington state and a sister in London. His childhood best friend was James and he has the best memories with him. He misses him and wishes he could find him again! He was raised in a Christian household and says his parents' prayers have had the biggest influence on his life. "I thank God for a praying Mom and Dad," he says. His parents' faith is the basis of his beliefs and traditions now. But he openly shared as part of his testimony that after he moved from London to the Bronx it was a bit of a culture shock and in an attempt to find a way to fit into the change, he jumped into doing a few things he regrets, like anyone can do.

His first job was a paper boy at 12 years old, followed by working at a bakery in the Bronx, Wall Street, and eventually working at a job in Manhattan where one day, a military man stopped by for a meal. Martin was impressed by how sharp his uniform was and asked about joining the military too! That led to 20 years of serving in the military in the pharmacy. He is glad he made that momentous choice. After retirement, he took an aptitude test that drew him to Social Work and into earning his Master's of Social Work. Martin Davy is currently dating a wonderful woman, Lauren, and is excited for their future together. He has known she was the one for 23 years and believes choosing a spouse is the second biggest decision you can make after the one about where you will spend eternity.

Martin says, "I seek the Kingdom in my walk and keep God first—in serving others. People may pat me on the back for that, but I say that doing this is a two-way street for sure. The kids bless me." He enjoys hanging out with the kids and being a part of a community. In addition to working at WCA in before and after care, he is helping many through his court-appointed advocacy job for foster children. Leaning back in his chair and rubbing his hands together thoughtfully, Martin says, "We are here for a reason. In this moment, God is here...That makes for a pretty good day."






